## 1. Notes of Previous Meeting

### Harmans Water Traffic Calming

It was confirmed that the consultation period was now closed and once the date for installing the yellow lines was known this would be circulated to the Group. **Action; Trevor Kensall**

### Installation of Water Distribution System

It was clarified to that it was South East Water installing the water distribution system and not Thames Water and that because the area concerned was outside the Special Protection Area work would continue through May. It was noted that the gates to the works were not particularly secure and children were accessing the site and this would be followed up with the site manager. **Action: Jasmine Arindell-Carty**

## 2. Update on Priorities

### Speeding

Speed enforcement activities carried out in other areas of the Borough had shown that the majority of speeding was done by local residents. The Police were identifying suitable places to carry out speed enforcement activities on Harmans Water Road and once this had been completed and the results of any enforcement activities would be used to support the case for additional measures to be taken.

### Environmental Matters

The Group acknowledged that fly tipping was a problem but if reported to the Council this would be cleared within a relatively short space of time and that the main problem was littering generally and it was agreed that a litter pick would be organised. **Action: Trevor Kensall/Shelagh Pile/Malcolm Young**

Littering was particularly prevalent in the vicinity of the Wayz Youth Centre at weekends when football and rugby players and spectators used the neighbouring playing fields. It was agreed that the Wayz would get involved in the litter pick. **Action: Lisa Oates**

It was agreed that CADIS data relating to the neighbourhood would be circulated and discussed in greater detail at the Group's next meeting. **Action: Trevor Kensall**

### Inconsiderate Parking

The yellow lines had now been put in around Martins Heron Station and although there had been a handful of incidents in Brockenhurst Road, Holton Heath and Sandford Down they were generally thought to be proving effective. A log was being kept of any reported incidents and this would be looked at in six months time to ascertain the success or otherwise of the yellow lines.

A van was consistently being parked on the junction of Uffington Drive and Walbury and obstructing the lines of sight. It was agreed that the van could be parked in the car park of the New Town Pippin and the vehicle's owner would be contacted by the police to discuss the situation.
